

### 2024 ICBC Scholarship Competition Application

# Sponsored by Colorado's Independent Community Banks and Independent Community Bankers of Colorado

Independent Community Bankers of Colorado (ICBC) will award five (5) \$1,750 one-time, one-year scholarships, to be applied towards the cost of tuition, fees, and books at a public or private university, college, junior or community college, or vocation/trade school. Awardees will be announced April 26, 2024. Payment will be made directly to the school following enrollment and after classes have begun. This is a statewide scholarship contest.

#### Eliaibility

In order to be eligible, the student must be a full-time high school senior. The student must have applied to, and will attend, a Colorado public or private university, college, junior or community college, or vocation/trade school after high school graduation. The student or his/her parent(s) or guardian(s) may not be an employee of the Independent Bankers of Colorado. In addition, due to the far reaching possible ramifications of Amendment 41, Ethics in Government, that amended Colorado's Constitution, if the student or his/her parent(s) work for a city, state or county office, you may not be eligible for this scholarship contest. Before applying, please consult with your trusted advisor on this issue.

#### Requirements

- Cumulative 3.0 GPA.
- Student must attend a university, college, junior or community college, or vocation/trade school after high school graduation.
- Student or parent(s)/guardian(s) have a banking relationship at an **ICBC member bank or branch** for at least six months. To find out if your bank is an ICBC member call 720-607-7937 or visit <a href="https://icbcolo.org/scholarship">https://icbcolo.org/scholarship</a> for a list.

- Application must be completed, typed, and signed by a bank representative.
- Student must answer the assigned essay question.
- Deadline for submission to your bank is Friday, March 29, 2024.

#### Selection of Scholarship Recipients

ICBC's independent scholarship committee reviews received applications and selects five \$1,750 scholarship recipients. Recipients will be announced April 29, 2024. Scholarships are *not* based on financial need but on the quality of the application, references, and essay response. Awards will be presented at ICBC's Annual Convention on Thursday, September 19, 2024, at The Hythe, Vail.

#### Along with the completed application, the student must also submit:

- 1. Three (3) letters of recommendation, at least one must be from a school counselor or teacher and one personal reference.
- 2. Verification of acceptance to a public or private university, college, junior or community college, or vocation/trade school. Students may also submit their ACT and/or SAT scores with their application.

	5.	Proper signatures where required.
	6.	Application must be complete and either <b>printed</b> or <b>typed</b> . Essay <b>must</b> be <b>typed</b> and double-spaced.
	7.	Return pages of application in correct order and do <b>NOT</b> copy/print double-sided.
	8.	Please paper clip your application. Do <b>NOT</b> staple or place in a binder.
	9.	Return completed package to your bank on or before Friday, March 29, 2024.
	10.	Do <b>NOT</b> return this sheet with your application. Return only pages 2-5.

ESSAY GRADING CRITERIA Essays will be graded using these five criteria: 1. Comprehension: How well does the essay reflect a thorough understanding of the economic issues of the topic? 2. Organization: Does the argument follow a logical and easily understood progression? Does the corroborating evidence support the essay's main points? 3. Conclusions: Do the conclusions follow logically from the argument? Are the conclusions compelling? 4. Creativity: Were diverse resources and ideas used to develop the main points? 5. Writing Style: Were concise language and correct grammar, spelling, and punctuation used?
